October 8, 2013

The meeting was called to order by Commodore **Therese Straigis** at 7:30pm at Borio's Restaurant. There were about 24 Fleet members in attendance. They will keep their boat at Therre's marina. They have

joined the Fleet! Commodore Straigis welcomed them and everyone to the meeting!

**Secretary's Report**. Secretary **Bruce Krupke** reported the September minutes were put into the Fleet newsletter by Editor **Theresa White** and Publisher **Donna Wilson**. There weren't any changes or additions to the minutes. There was a

motion to accept the minutes, seconded and carried.



**Treasurer's Report**. Treasurer **Dr. Bill Whalen** noted the checking accounts are about the same as last month in our 2 accounts with strong balances. All bills from the Outing have been paid. The total expenses for the Labor Day weekend outing was \$1,256, a little higher than last year. Dr. Whalen noted there was really good attendance at the outing this year. There was a motion to accept the Treasurer's report, seconded and passed.



**Division 16 Report**: Div. 16 Chairman **Adam Atherton** was away on business and was not able to attend the meeting. It was reported he is working on other trying to fill out the 2014 regatta schedule and is continuing discussions with Fleets in Buffalo, Oswego, and Owasco.

### Past Regattas Report:

- Shore Acres in NJ: No one from our Fleet attended.
- CMOR (Canandaigua): Herb and Sharon James took first place in the H16 division. Everyone had a good time; they put on a great event. There was one race on Saturday and three on Sunday. It was Sharon's birthday and celebrated by all. There was discussion regarding scoring. The weather was a bit colder than usual with showers. It was very windy on Sat. clocking at about 20 mph plus. The last two races on Sunday were mass starts, meaning all boats together. The Sharks from the yacht club are good competition. There was good discussion regarding having a large mass group start and who



likes it or not. It depends on how the course is set. We should bring our Hobie Flag H for the Bar next year.

- Rock Hall, MD: No one attended. It conflicted with Canandaigua!
- Division 11 Rehoboth Delaware Regatta: Don Podejko attended his first official regatta crewing for Robin Longo. He reported there were 8 races, four each day with lighter winds on Sat. and better/more wind on Sunday. He said everyone including himself had a very



good time. He said he camped out but noted finding a good spot for a tent is hard. **Bill Jeffers** took 6th; **Rob & Darcie Jerry** were 8th; **Bill Whalen** and **Bruce Krupke** came in 11th; **Bob and Gabe Longo** were 13<sup>th</sup>; **Robin Longo** and **Don Podejko** took 14th. The full results can be found on our racing webpage. **Bob Longo** reported he had a wheel bearing go on the way down. He wanted to thank the **Jerrys** and **Libels** (Nick and Lawrence, from Canada) for their help on the highway. **Rob Jerry** noted he was the rescuer not the rescued on this trip for once! Many noted this is a good lesson to be noted for future regatta trips; maybe have a few extra spare part in inventory just in case. • Winter Florida sailing/regattas were discussed. There are two regattas in Florida already



scheduled for the winter. **Tradewinds**in mid January in Islamorada,
Florida Keys, non Hobie points; and
Port Charlotte Harbor Regatta,
Punta Gorda, FL., in early February, a
Hobie Points regatta, located about
120 miles south of Tampa on the gulf
coast. Notice of Races, (NOR's) are
posted for each of these regattas on
their websites. The other regatta held
east of the Mississippi somewhere

during colder months, called **Mid-Winter's East**, (MWE) a Hobie regatta, with points, has not been scheduled yet. Bruce Krupke reported through communications with the Yacht club in Port Charlotte they are willing to host the regatta. They have three weekends identified they have offered to hold the regatta; early Feb.; early April, late April. **Bridget Quatrone** is working on trying to solidify the location for MWE and dates. There was general support for an April MWE regatta.


together for this important effort.


